General Materials Needed: *these items may be acquired after the first session when a review of the materials will demonstrate their use.*

Class #1 & #2 - All materials for the entire course will be explained.

The first demo will use the following items: Plexiglas plate 8x10 or 9x12 inches, small soft rubber brayer, Speedball black water-soluble ink, Asian or bond paper, tracing paper, newsprint pad, pencil, small pieces of cheesecloth or soft rag, masking tape, safety razor blade or X-Acto knife, wooden spoon.

Class #3 – Waterbased mediums will be introduced. Materials needed may include watercolor brushes, watercolor paints, Caran D’Ache water soluble crayons.

Other needs - pencil, ball pen, sharpie marker, scissors, paper towels, small amount of dish detergent, water containers such as paper cups, or small food storage containers, papers to include some Asian papers such as mulberry, Kita-Kata, & Masa.

Image Ideas – sketches or photographs, or newspaper and magazine images.
