



## CONTINUING EDUCATION PROGRAMS MATERIALS LIST

Course: PT 600EL\_ON / Oil Painting in Layers: Achieving Luminous Color & Depth Instructor: Jill A. Rupinski Days/Dates: 6 weeks, Tuesday, July 6 –August 10 Time: 6:00 – 8:00 pm

For all projects the following pigments of either Alkyd or Standard Oil Paint are recommended:

- Cadmium Red Medium or Napthol Red
- Quinacridone Red *or* Alizarin Crimson
- Cadmium or Hansa Yellow Light or Medium
- Transparent Yellow
- Ultramarine Blue
- Phthalo or Prussian Blue
- Phthalo or Viridian Green (Optional)
- Burnt Sienna
- Titanium or any Lead White Flake or Cremnitz White
- Mars Black (Ivory Black, if you have it already)

Palette—Paper or Glass (especially for Alkyd Paints) Wood (for oil paints)

Oil Painting Brushes— minimum 3 brushes in a variety of sizes, both bristle and soft hair, natural or synthetic

Filberts and flats, #6, 8, 10, 12

Palette knife—metal type preferably one with a "dog leg bend". Do not buy a plastic knife or stiff metal. The Nicole brand is inferior.

Solvent—Turpenoid or Gamsol

Jars—2 clean jars with lids, 1 with large mouth

Palette cup-cat food cans (or similar size) are ideal

Rags/paper—white cotton rags cut into 6-inch squares, or paper towels

The goal is to experience approaches to layering in indirect painting methods. Students will develop both tonal and chromatic painting skills layering Alkyd Oil or standard Oil Paint over an Underpainting of Alkyd or Acrylic Paint. The surface primer may be Acrylic or Oil Primed grounds as follows:

- a. Purchase panels or canvases pre-primed with Acrylic or Oil.
- b. Purchase unprimed substrates and an Acrylic Primer to prepare your own painting surface.

You may already have suitable products. I have listed choices for this course based on low cost. To fully experience the methods that will be demonstrated, you should have <u>three</u> surface types as follows:

Project #1. One White Acrylic Primed Hardboard **Smooth Surface** - *Masonite or* Plywood/Cradled or Uncradled

Ampersand Gesso Board Single Flat 1/8" Panel (Value Series) - 8X8 in, \$3.67

Unprimed *Masonite* or Plywood (Cradled or Uncradled) prepared with your own ground. Acrylic Gesso Ground

Project #2. One White Primed Linen Surface - Stretched Linen or on Hardboard Centurion Universal Acrylic Primed Linen Panels (Jerry's Artarama)

- These come in packs of three but are very affordable. 8X8 in, \$6.66

Project #3. One Tonal Surface of any Canvas, Linen, Cotton or Smooth surface

Pro-Tones All-Media Toned Canvas Panels

- These come in packs of three of the same color. 8X10 in, \$5.90

Pro-Tones All-Media Toned Canvas Pads

Fredrix Can-Tone Pre-Toned Canvas Pads

- Acrylic Ground on any substrate that you will tone yourself.

## Paints/Pigments and other materials

For Project #1

- a. One Sanguine Chalk Pencil or Sanguine Chalk Stick
- b. Eraser
- c. A small watercolor brush

For all projects one or both of the following materials may be used:

a. an Alkyd Resin Medium - *Liquin, Liquin Fine Detail, Galkyd, Galkyd Lite, Neo-Megilp* along with standard oil paints

b. Alkyd Resin paints - Titanium White, Burnt Sienna, Ultramarine Blue. Alkyd Resin Oil paints are mixable with standard oil paints.

You will also receive an invitation to join *Canvas*, PAFA's online learning management system, on, or shortly before, the course start date. Your username is the email you registered with, and you will need to set up your password. Canvas is the website where the syllabus, assignments, videos, and feedback will be.
