## Materials List

**Please have all armature supplies ready for the first class meeting.**

- You will need at least 8 lbs of oil clay. Recommended brands include: Chavant plasteline or Clayette (medium), Monster Clay (medium), and Van Aken Protolina (medium). Klean Clay is suitable though no longer in production. Available at Amazon, Blick Art supplies.
- Calipers (available at Blick, amazon, etc)
- Set of wooden modeling tools, including rake. Available at Blick, Amazon, Norristown Pottery Supply. Please also bring a dinner knife, we will use it for modeling.

### Armature Supplies

Galvanized plumbing pipes and fittings can be found at Lowes, Home Depot, or other hardware store.

- 12" galvanized steel pipe ½" diameter
- Galvanized steel flange ½" diameter
- 90-degree galvanized steel reducing elbow, ½ x 3/8" • Galvanized steel tee 3/8" diameter
- 6" galvanized steel pipe, 3/8" diameter
- 4 gauge aluminum armature wire (Blick)
- 11 ½ gage aluminum armature wire, small spool (Blick)
- ¾" Plywood board with runners, supplied by Academy woodshop Texts:
- Human Anatomy for Artists: Elements of Form, Eliot Goldfinger, Oxford University Press, 1991
- I will bring in supplementary handouts, books, etc. The above text is a great investment but each student does not need to bring a copy to class.

**IMPORTANT:** Owing to supply chain disruptions, sculpture supplies have been difficult for students to find locally. I suggest that you get all of the above supplies in advance so that you are ready to start work on the first day of class.
