CLAY

- 25 lbs of clay- low grog. Any color will work.
- I like Sedona Red available thru Dick Blick and Sculpture House, but other clay is fine as well.

TOOLS

- Sculpture House has 2 nice Modeling Tool Kits available online. They deliver in a few days.

OR you may purchase individual tools:

I prefer wood tools, but plastic is OK, although these tend to bend or break

- One large tool 6- to 10-inches long
- Several smaller tools
- A "loop" or "rake" tool
- A ceramic metal "rib" tool—you want one that's a little flexible. You can also use a piece of flexible plastic (like a fake credit card they send in the mail – these are nice because you can cut them down).

OTHER SUPPLIES

- A spray bottle for water
- A plastic trash bag

PLYWOOD

- At least 12 x 12 inches (You may be able to get a piece of scrap from Home Depot)
- Wooden dowels, chopsticks, skewers (these will help stabilize your sculpture while you're working)

SUPPLIERS

- Blick Art Materials—Broad and Chestnut Street
- Sculpture House—can order online and have delivered that week

Sculpture Shop Access for CE Students

- Access to the Sculpture Shop for any CE student enrolled in a sculpture course begins on the first day of the scheduled class and ends on the last day of the scheduled class.
