- Scissors and/or utility knife
- An adhesive (preferably Neutral PH for archival reasons) such as:
 - acrylic matte medium
 - Craft glue - Mod Podge, Tacky Glue
 - Photo mount spray adhesive
 - PVA glue (neutral PH brands include; Gambling, Tran Archival, Books By Hand, Lineco)
- A collection of scraps, objects, photos -- anything that you find interesting, intriguing, compelling, or respond to for any reason, and that can be attached to a piece of paper, cardboard, or canvas.
- Paper, cardboard or canvas to glue collage parts and elements to. These can be any size. Your choice may depend on how large or small you like to work, or how you want the size of your collage parts to relate to the size of your backing. 8" x 12" to 18" x 24" would be fine.

PLEASE NOTE:

The above list is more than adequate, but we are by no means limited to it. An important intention of the class is to expand and broaden our definitions of collage and assemblage, and we will therefore be looking for new and different materials to use and methods for adhering and attaching them.
