The first session will include a discussion of materials and evaluation of individual goals for the class. I recommend waiting to buy the following materials until after the first class:

- □ Korn's Litho Pencils, Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5
- Korn's Litho Crayons, Nos. 00, 0, 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5
 - * "Stones" Litho crayons may be substituted for Korn's drawing materials
- □ Tusche liquid, stick, or paste from Korn's, Stone, or other.
 - □ Korn's Lithographic Rubbing Ink (soft, medium, or hard)
 - Assortment of inexpensive watercolor brushes
 - □ Straight pen (for Tusche Drawing) plus nibs
 - □ An assortment of printmaking or rag papers Somerset, Arches Cover, and Rives BFK are preferred brands. Stonehenge and Lenox are cheaper alternatives.

These materials will be needed by all:

- □ 2 fine-pore sponges (available in Blick Store)
- □ Pad of Newsprint 18" x 24"
- □ 1" flexible putty knife
- □ Fine Tip Sharpie
- □ 1" wide masking tape roll
- □ Apron/lab coat
- □ Small Japanese bamboo brush
- Mechanical Pencil

All materials including printmaking paper are available at the Center City Blick Art Materials store.

Print Shop Access for CE Students
